

Directions to Beavers Bend and our Cabins


(also see maps)

- From Dallas, take **Interstate 30 east** out of Dallas, past Mount Pleasant.
- Take the US-259 exit,
 EXIT 178, toward DeKalb/Daingerfield.
- Turn **Left onto US-259 N** (Crossing into Oklahoma). Drive through Broken Bow, OK.
- Continue on SH 259 north from Broken Bow and drive approx.
 9 miles. Go past the first 259-A exit to the 2nd 259-A exit and turn right on the Broken Bow Lake Dam Road.
- Go east .8 mile (that's eight tenths of one mile) and turn right into the second entrance to the new **Oak Ridge** subdivision (the 2nd mailbox). Look for the metal **red and white Oak Ridge sign** (back from the driveway) on a tree. *If you reach the gated Oak Ridge addition, you have gone just a tiny bit too far.*
- Turn right into Oak Ridge addition, then turn left at the first road, called Red Oak. Then go straight to the back of the addition.
- **Winding Creek Lodge** is at the end of the road, where it ends in a "Y", just slightly on the left.


Map 1 – Highways Overview

Please note: Some activities have seasonal hours / days of operation, or depend on good weather

Beavers Bend Fly Shop – Fly Fishing - We offer Fly Fishing Guide services, and provide up to 3 anglers (per Guide) an enjoyable day of fishing. Flycasting instruction is given when needed for new fishermen. Wade-fishing only, catch and release is suggested. We are a Full Service Fly Shop. We can supply all your gear and fly needs for your fly fishing trip. The designated trout stream is 12 miles long and holds thousands of rainbow and brown trout. The Lower Mountain Fork River is a year round fishery located only 3 hours from Dallas/Ft. Worth.

<u>Lake Boat Rental</u> – Reserve ahead online, or in-person only at Beavers Bend Marina – Rent all types of watercraft & boat slips from the only marina on the lake. Call 580-494-6455.

Horseback Riding – Beavers Bend Stables are located inside Beavers Bend State Park. The horses ride every hour at the top of the hour from 8:30 to 4, Tues. – Sat. (closed Sun & Mon, except major holidays). No need for reservations – just show up. Days of operation vary, according to the time of year & weather permitting. For more info, call 580-494-6613.

<u>Train Depot</u> - The train ride is located next to the horse stables inside Beavers Bend State Park. No need for a reservation. You will probably see some wildlife during the narrated ride, winding through the forest on an old fashion locomotive. For more info, call 580-494-6613. Days of operation vary, according to the time of year & weather permitting.

Golf - Cedar Creek Golf Course & Pro Shop - 2.5 miles north of Hochatown and right next to the lake. Call ahead to schedule a tee time & cart, (580) 494-6456.

Zip Lining - Rugaru Adventures offers an experience like no other in the area. Certified & trained guides will take you on a zipline adventure tour of 6 lines totaling over a half-mile while enjoying the breathtaking scenery. Hours of operation vary, according to the time of year & weather permitting. This exciting adventure starts by taking you through the canopies of the forest and ends with an amazing view over Broken Bow Lake. The tour consists of 6 zip lines that range in length from 300 to 1100 ft. for a total approximate distance of 3,200 ft. Each tour lasts about 2 hours. The weight requirements are 70 lbs. to 250 lbs. and the harness must fit correctly. Located on the Steven's Gap Rd. Phone: 580-494-2947. Cost: \$75 per person.

Riverman Trail Rides - Enjoy an authentic Western horseback ride as you climb and descend mountains or cross creeks. Located 10 miles west of Broken Bow on Hwy. 3 - turn right @ the North Pole store & go 2 miles north. Call 405-833-6671 for reservations.

ATV Riding – Enjoy a full day of 4-wheeling with breathtaking views you will never forget. There are no ATV rentals in the Broken Bow area, so you will need to bring your own, or rent from home. A good place to ride (no permits required) is both sides of Hwy. 259, 1.5 miles north of the Cedar Creek Golf Course / 1 mile north of Northern Hills. It is unlawful to ride ATV's on the county roads, including the roads around your cabin. Please wear helmets and stay on the trails – not the forest floor. Please get an ATV trail map at the stores in Hochatown, and read the laws carefully. You could be fined for not following the ATV laws!

<u>Hiking Trails & Nature Trails</u> – stop by the Forest Heritage Center museum and pick up a map of all the hiking and nature trails in the area. They can point you in the right direction to take a leisurely walk through nature, or hike upward toward the most gorgeous mountaintop views!

Go-Carting - 2 Hochatown locations:

- 1. Across from the main State Park entrance Hwy. 259-A next to the general store & Adam & Eve's coffee shop.
- 2. Behind Abendigo's parking lot on Stephens Gap Rd., also features a rock climbing wall.

Duck Tours on Broken Bow Lake - A fun way to tour the lake. Hours of operation vary, according to the time of year & weather permitting. A large yellow floating bus provides a fun way to explore the lake for 50 minutes. Adults: \$20 / 4-12: \$15 / 3 & under free Open 10:30am - 5:30pm Call (580) 494-DUCK

Forest Heritage Center Museum – walk through magnificent murals depicting the history of the area's forestry industry. Open 365 days per year – no charge.

<u>Uncle Charlie's Old Time Photos</u> - Travel back to the turn of the century as the town sheriff or a colonel in the Confederate or Union army. Select from the Wild or Formal West, Victorian or Civil War periods. Just for the fun of it! Prices start at \$25.00 per session for one 8X10, or two 5X 7. Located on the west side of Hwy. 259, just 2 miles north of 259-A - the main entrance into Beavers Bend State Park, next to Secluded Acres Country Store.
