





The **Protestant Reformation**, to a large degree, was a "back-to-the-Bible" (Bible literacy) movement.






Early on, the Protestant Reformation was a religious **liberty** (i.e., anti-persecution) **movement**, too.









"For wherever the Gospel is purely preached, there men have a sure rule for their faith, and by that they are able to guard against idolatry. 
Satan's tactic of displacement.

- "subtracting from the Word": <u>Sadducees</u> used <u>doubt/denial</u> of parts of God's Word to dodge the authority of (and their obligation to obey undervalued parts of the O.T. Scriptures.
- "adding to the Word": <u>Pharisees</u> used their <u>religious tradition</u> to usurp the Bible's proper place of authority.
- Just as any substitute for Scripture is a **counterfeit** Bible; likewise, any substitute for Christ is an idol thus "**Churchianity**" is the tragic result of "**Church**" **replacing Christ**, in theology and/or in experience.

For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed Me [i.e., Jesus], for he wrote of Me. But if ye believe not his writings, how shall ye believe My words? (John 5:46-47)






Nehemiah 8:1 (NKJV)




And Ezra the priest <u>brought the law</u> [Torah] <u>before the congregation</u> both of men and women, and all that could hear with understanding, upon the 1st day of the 7th month. (Nehemiah 8:2)



Observation: when people sincerely sought to be taught from God's Word, God sent Bible teachers – ready, willing, and able to teach.


And he read therein before the street that was before the water gate from the morning until midday, before the men and the women, and those that could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive unto the book of the law. (Nehemiah 8:3)






<u>Observation</u>: when God's Word was read publicly, to God's people, the people (who were old enough) were <u>attentive</u> to it – all morning long.


And Ezra the scribe stood upon a pulpit of wood, which they had made for the purpose; (Nehemiah 8:4)





Observation: When the Bible was to be taught, publicly, actions were taken to utilize practical technology to maximize the event's success.


And Ezra <u>opened the book in the sight of all the people</u> (for he was above all the people). And when he opened it, all the people stood up. <u>And Ezra blessed</u> the LORD, the great God. And all the people answered, <u>Amen, Amen,</u> (Nehemiah 8:5-6)






<u>Observation</u>: When publicly reading the Scriptures, the Bible should be conspicuous, to emphasize that God's Word is being read and taught. Also, reading God's Word should include an **attitude of worship**.


Also Joshua [and others] caused the people to understand the law. ... So they <u>read</u> in the book in the law of God <u>distinctly</u>, and <u>gave the</u> <u>sense</u>, and <u>caused them to understand</u> the reading. (Nehemiah 8:7-8)






Observation: we need to have God's Word read and explained. This involves literally reading Bible's text, then explaining what it means.

And Nehemiah [and Ezra, and the other Bible scribe-teachers] said unto all the people, This day is **holy** unto the LORD your God; mourn not, nor weep. For all the people wept, when they heard the words of the law. (Nehemiah 8:9)





<u>Observation</u>: when God's people really listen to the reading of **God's Word**, and have it explained, this produces an immediate recognition of personal and corporate sins, resulting in grief and sorrow.

Then he said unto them, Go your way, eat the fat, and drink the sweet, and send portions unto them for whom nothing is prepared: for this day is holy unto our LORD: neither be ye sorry, because the joy of the LORD is your strength. (Nehemiah 8:10)





Observation: Feeling sorry for our sins and failures is worthwhile, but it doesn't fuel us! It's the joy of the LORD that's our strength!

So the Levites stilled all the people, saying, Hold your peace, for the day is holy; neither be ye grieved. And all the people went their way to <u>eat</u>, and to <u>drink</u>, and to <u>send portions</u>, and to <u>make great mirth</u>, <u>because they had understood the words that were declared unto them</u>. (Nehemiah 8:11-12)


Observation / Application: Although attentively hearing (or reading) and understanding God's Word is humbling, it is moreso a joyful and fortifying blessing, worth a hearty and festive celebration (and maybe even some rejoicing that includes feasting!), joy to be somehow shared with others!



Remember Jonah? Our repentance is God's relief!

And God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God repented of [God was relieved* regarding] the calamity that He had said that He would do unto them; and He did it not.


(Jonah 3:10) *nâḥam niphâl [to console, relieve, comfort, sympathize, pity]



When we've humbled our hearts to God, as forgiven sinners (1st John 1:9), due to our hearing and revering His written Word, we appreciate His mercy and grace in our Lord Jesus Christ (Who solved our sin problem, securing us as clean before God). So, being forgiven, we now focus on the joy of belonging to Him! (Luke 10:20)



I rejoice at Thy Word, as one who finds great treasure. (Psalm 139:162)



And they <u>found written in the law which the LORD had commanded by Moses</u>, that the children of Israel should dwell in booths, in the feast of the 7th month ... fetch olive branches, and pine branches, and myrtle branches, and palm branches, and branches of thick trees, to make booths, <u>as it is written</u> [for properly observing the Feast of Tabernacles] ... And all the congregation of them that were come again out of the captivity made booths, and sat under the booths. For since the days of Joshua the son of Nun unto that day had not the children of Israel done so. And there was very great gladness. (Nehemiah 8:14-15 & 8:17)







Observation: obeying God's Word, and taking action to honor and celebrate His glory ("as it is written"), is the right thing to do, plus "very great gladness" results!

Also day by day, from the 1st day unto the last day, he read in the Book of the law of God. And they kept the feast [of Booths] 7 days. And on the 8th day was a solemn assembly, (Nehemiah 8:18)






Observation: Reading and learning God's Word is **not** a 1-day experience. And, as **Matthew 4:4**, Psalm 1, and Joshua 1:8 teach us, we always need to take in God's Word, daily.

- 5. Soli Deo Gloria (glory to God alone)




