
#### Media Influence



# Heavy Viewers


- Overestimate their likelihood of being involved in a violent crime.
- Overestimate percentage of people in white collar occupations.
- Overestimate percentage of Americans compared to rest of world.


#### Television & Behavior

- Study of adolescents showed that watching sex on TV influences teens to have sex (Pediatrics, 2004).
- Over 1000 studies point to a causal connection between media and aggressive behavior in some children (Pediatrics, 2000).









#### Worldview: News Media


- <u>Liberal</u> 80% always voted for Democratic candidate.
- <u>Secular</u> 86% seldom or never attended religious services, 50% had no religious affiliation.
- <u>Humanistic</u> 90% support a woman's right to choose.




#### Worldview: Television

- Most had some religious upbringing.
- <u>Liberal</u> 80% always voted for Democratic candidate.
- <u>Secular</u> 93% seldom or never attended religious services, 45% had no religious affiliation.










- In the movie 2001: A Space Odyssey, Dave Bowman begins disconnecting the memory circuits of HAL.
- "Dave, my mind is going"
   HAL says forlornly. "I can feel it. I can feel it."



"I can feel it too. Over the past few years I've had an uncomfortable sense that someone, or something, has been tinkering with my brain, remapping the neural circuitry, reprogramming the memory."



- Edward Taub conducted experiments on right-handed violinists.



London taxi drivers - posterior hippocampus (spacial data) was much larger than normal.








#### • Concentration

- Distraction overload leaves user with the: "Where was I"? brain lock.
- Continuous Partial Attention not multitasking, rapid-fire switching of attention.
- Creativity no "think time" or daydreaming

- George Barna, "Media Addiction," January 2010.
- Show all the signs of addiction (American Psychiatry Association).
- Parents understand the dangers (3/4ths say exposure of their children to inappropriate content is one of their top concerns).






